The Tafnit program for Matriculation – "Last Hurdle"

in high schools in Druze communities 2006-2007

Studying for Matriculation

All the information in this report, is based on figures that were provided by the participating schools.



Part A - Principle Results

- 1. Eighty-six 11th and 12th grade students participated in the program (Eighty from the11th grade and six from the 12th grade) from five high schools in four communities: Hurfeish, Mughar, Peqi'in, and Ir Carmel.
- 2. Of the students who began the program, 97.7% participated until the end (2.3% dropped out 2 students).
- 3. Of the students who began the program, 95.3% (82 out of 86 students) passed the obstacle subject exam of the Matriculation.
- 4. The average grade in the obstacle subject exam of the Matriculation, of all those participating in the program (including those who did not pass) 76.4.
- 5. From the six 12th grade students in the program, 83% (5 students) achieved a Matriculation certificate by passing the obstacle subject exam in the Matriculation.
- 6. We will know the rate of the participating 11th grade students who will be entitled to a Matriculation certificate when they finish 12th grade at the end of the 2007-2008 school year.

Part B - Goals

A. Goals and target population

Eighty-six 11th and 12th grade students, from five high schools in four communities (as detailed in Table 1), whom the school predicts have no chance of passing the Matriculation examinations in the obstacle subject needed for eligibility for a Matriculation certificate. For 73 (84.3%) of them it is a obstacle subject (the remaining thirteen students who make up the group numbers have more than one hurdle subjects for Matriculation), and will be entitled to a Matriculation certificate if they succeed in that subject in the Summer 2007 examinations.

These students will study using Tafnit Program's Accelerated Narrowing of the Gaps Method ("The Study Campaign"), and have full success in the hurdle subject in Summer 2007.

B. Mapping to select students, subject studied and size of group.

- 1. A mapping was carried out by the participating schools amongst 11th grade students to locate the obstacle subject and students who could potentially participate in the program. The obstacle subject was decided upon on condition that it was the only subject standing in the way of eligibility to a Matriculation certificate, as shown by the mapping results.
- 2. There were 86 students (80 from 11th grade, and 6 from 12th grade) from five high schools and four communities, participating in the program. A total of 73 fitted in with the program entry criterion, with the other 13 making up the numbers.
